#### 3 PURPOSE

These Program Requirements set out the approved requirements for the Master of Teaching (Primary Education).

#### 4 OVFRVIFW

#### 4.1 Campus Availability

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) has been approved for delivery on the Fremantle campus.

#### 4.2 Student Availability

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is available for enrolment to domestic Students and international Students with a student visa.

#### 4.3 Australian Qualifications Framework

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is accredited by the University as a Level 9 AQF qualification.

#### 4.4 Duration

The Volume of Learning for the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is two (2) years of equivalent full-time study.

An option to complete this Program Part-time is available.

An accelerated option to complete the Program is not available.

#### 4.5 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) Award is 5 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

#### 4.6 Study Mode

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is offered in Internal Study mode.

#### 4.7 Professional Accreditation

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is accredited by the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership (AITSL) via its agency the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia (TRBWA).

#### 5 ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

#### 5.1 University Admission Requirements

To be eligible for admission to The University of Notre Dame Australia, all applicants must meet the <u>University's minimum requirements for admission</u>. The requirements for admission are detailed in the University's Policy: *Admissions*.

#### 5.2 Specific Program Requirements for Admission

Academic requirements for admission to the Master of Teaching (Primary) are:

- 5.2.1 This award is only available to those who hold a recognized Bachelor Degree.
- 5.2.2 Education students who have English as an Additional language and ae admitted on the basis of an International Language Testing System (IELTS) assessment, or an equivalent English language proficiency assessment, are only admitted if they have attained an overall IELTS (or equivalent) score of 8.0 (with no score below 7.0 in any of the four skills areas and a score of no less than 8.0 in speaking and listening).

### 6 PRACTICUM OR INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

**6.1** Students in the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) are required to complete a minimum of 20 weeks of practicum that is comprised of:

EDUC5370 Professional Experience 1 Master of Teaching Primary (10 continuous weeks in duration – 400 hrs)

EDUC5389 Professional Experience 2 Master of Teaching Primary (10 continuous weeks in duration – 400 hrs)

**6.2** Students are required to provide relevant clearance documents as directed by the School of Education.

#### 7 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

#### 7.1 Program Description

The Master of Teaching (Primary Education) is a program for those who already have an undergraduate degree from a different field and wish to enter teaching. This two-year full-time (or part-time equivalent) teaching degree is recognised by the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia and offers contemporary coursework, exposure to the latest learning technologies, and the integration of theory and practice needed to teach primary school age children. Upon graduation students are eligible to teach in Catholic, Government and Independent primary schools in WA. The practical component of this program involves 20 weeks of teaching practice spread across two years. This practical experience provides a total immersion in the classroom environment, exposing the student to the lived experience of a teacher.

Education students in WA must achieve the standards of the National Literacy and Numeracy for Initial Teacher Education Students (LANTITE). The test is administered externally by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER). Education students also need to successfully complete the Graduate Teacher Performance Assessment after their final teaching placement in order to graduate from this program.

#### 7.2 Program Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) graduates will be able to:

- 1. Apply an advanced and integrated understanding of the complex body of knowledge within the curriculum as prescribed through curricular, policy and accreditation bodies.
- 2. Research and apply established theories for planning and implementing teaching and learning engagements for children of diverse backgrounds and abilities based on sound understandings of pedagogy that draw on such research and theory.
- 3. Synthesise learning gained from applying on-campus studies of research-based theory in multiple, varied and extended Professional Experience opportunities with accomplished teachers in a mentoring context within classrooms and schools.
- 4. Apply an advanced and integrated understanding of child development for the physical, social, cognitive, emotional, and cultural domains that will enable accurate and useful planning, programming, and assessment of learning and for learning.
- 5. Utilise skills for engaging appropriately and effectively with parents and caregivers, as well as stakeholder professionals and external organisations, through the acquisition of a wide and varied repertoire of assessment, evaluation, reporting and communication strategies.
- 6. Transmit established dispositions of critical reflection for:
  - The continual improvement of teaching
  - Commitment to ongoing learning to maintain and improve knowledge and skills
  - Effective collaboration to engage with professional colleagues within and beyond the school
  - mindfulness of all aspects of children's achievement and wellbeing within schools and school systems.
  - 7. Demonstrate research capacity by planning and executing a research-based project

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#### 7.3 Required Courses

- To be eligible for the award of Master of Teaching (Primary Education) students must complete a minimum of 400 Units of Credit chosen from the courses listed in Appendix A.
- 90 Units of Credit from two (2) Practicum Courses
- 185 Units of Credit from seventeen (17) Compulsory Courses
- 125 Units of Credit from five (5) Courses, including a Core Curriculum Course, related to an Accreditation or non-Accreditation pathway.

#### 7.4 Elective Courses

There are no elective courses in the Master of Teaching (Primary Education) for student completing Accreditation to Teach Religious Education in a Catholic school.

#### 7.5 Special Award Requirements

7.5.1 In their first year, all students will be required to attempt the national Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE). Prior to being eligible for the final internship professional placement in the program all students must successfully demonstrate the required minimum level of personal literacy and numeracy through meeting the standard on LANTITE.

The test is administered externally by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) (<a href="https://teacheredtest.acer.edu.au/register">https://teacheredtest.acer.edu.au/register</a>). Students will be required to register with ACER and pay for the test.

7.5.2 All students must successfully complete the Graduate Teacher Performance Assessment (GTPA) after completing the final teaching internship in order to graduate from this program.

#### 7.6 Course substitutions

Course substitutions, where permitted, must be approved by the Dean.
